Mission for Advancement in High-Impact Areas (MAHA) - MedTech Mission launched

MAHA-MedTech Mission has been launched by the **Anusandhan** National Research Foundation (ANRF), in collaboration with the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR) and the Gates Foundation.

➤ ANRF has been established, through ANRF Act, 2023, as an apex body to provide high-level strategic direction of scientific research as per recommendations of the National Education Policy.

About MAHA-MedTech Mission

- **Aim:** To accelerate innovation in India's medical technology sector, reduce reliance on high-cost imports, and promote equitable access to affordable and high-quality medical technologies.
- Funding: Provide funding support to a wide range of entities including Academic and R&D institutions, Hospitals, Startups, MSMEs, MedTech industry and collaborations between entities.
 - Milestone-linked funding of ₹5-25 crore per project (and up to ₹50 crore in exceptional cases).
- **Enabling Support:** Through national initiatives such as Patent Mitra (IP protection and technology transfer), MedTech Mitra (regulatory guidance and clearances), a Clinical Trial Network (for clinical validation and evidence generation) etc.
- ▶ Technology Areas: Innovative medical devices and IVD (In vitro diagnostics) including High-end Frontier Technologies (Deep Tech like Imaging, Radiotherapy equipment, Robotics, invasive technologies, implants, AI/ML enabled platforms & devices etc.).

India's MedTech Sector

- Recognised as a sunrise sector, with size estimated to be around \$14 billion and it is expected to grow to \$30 billion by 2030.
 - India's medical devices exports have crossed the \$4-billion mark.
- India is the fourth largest medical devices market in Asia after Japan, China, and South Korea.
- ▶ Government Policies: PLI Scheme, Promotion of Research and Innovation in Pharma MedTech Sector (PRIP) Scheme, National Medical Device Policy, Medical Device Parks etc.

Constitutional Morality, a tool to combat Social Evils

Dr. B. R. Ambedkar believed that the disparities and inequities in the society could be resolved based on the principle of constitutional morality, which is not a natural sentiment, but must be cultivated. What is Constitutional Morality?

- Meaning: It is the adherence to constitutional norms not only in letters but also in spirit.
 - The British Historian George Grote explained it as the balance between freedom and restraint, where citizens obey constitutional authorities and also have the freedom to criticize them.
- It is enshrined in in the Constitution under the Articles:
 - Fundamental Rights (Articles 12 to 35)
 - Directive Principles of State Policy (Articles 36 to 51)
 - Preamble
 - Fundamental Duties (Article 51-A).
- > Significance: Transforms constitutional guarantees into tangible justice, fostering inclusion, protecting minorities, and ensuring equality in a rapidly changing society.

How Courts have used Constitutional Morality in Bringing Social Change?

- Women Equality: In Indian Young Lawyers Association vs The State Of Kerala (2018), Supreme Court (SC) held unconstitutional the practice of **prohibiting the entry of menstruating women** to the Sabarimala temple.
- Protecting Privacy: In K.S. Puttaswamy v. Union of India (2018), SC upheld the right to privacy as a fundamental right signifying constitutional morality as it protects individual dignity, autonomy and freedom.
- Positive Transformation: In Navtej Singh Johar Case (2018), SC Struck down Section 377 of IPC (criminalising homosexuality), upholding constitutional morality over societal morality.
 - In Joseph Shine v. Union of India (2018), SC struck down Section 497 of IPC decriminalizing adultery.







72 nations signed the UN Convention against Cybercrime in Hanoi, Vietnam

It is the world's first legally binding global convention to prevent and respond to cybercrimes, adopted by the UN General Assembly in 2024.

▶ It will enter into force 90 days after ratification by at least 40 UN member states.

About UN Convention against Cybercrime

- **Electronic Evidence:** It is the first global framework for the collection, sharing and use of electronic evidence for all serious offences, establishing a global standard.
- > Criminalization of Cybercrimes: First global treaty to criminalize cyber-dependent crimes and also offences related to online fraud, online child sexual abuse and exploitation material and online grooming of children.
 - O It is first in recognising non-consensual dissemination of intimate images as an offence.
- **▶** Global Network: It creates the first global 24/7 Cooperation **Network** where countries can quickly initiate cooperation.

Cybercrimes

- Cybercrime falls into two broad categories: Cyber-enabled and cyber-dependent.
 - Ocyber-enabled crimes include traditional criminal activities conducted online, such as trafficking, fraud, and incitement to violence and hate.
 - Cyber-dependent crimes are those committed through the use of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) devices, including phishing, identity theft, and the deployment of malware and ransomware.
- speed and efficiency.



22nd Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN)-India Summit held in Malaysia

The two had elevated their ties from Strategic Partnership to Comprehensive Strategic Partnership (CSP) in 2022.

Key Highlights of the Summit

- Support for ASEAN-India Plan of Action to implement ASEAN-India Comprehensive Strategic Partnership (2026-2030).
- Adoption of the ASEAN-India Joint Leaders' Statement on Sustainable Tourism.
- Designating 2026 as "ASEAN-India Year of Maritime Cooperation".
- Proposed establishment of a Centre for Southeast Asian Studies at Nalanda University.
- ▶ Holding East Asia Summit Maritime Heritage Festival at Lothal, Gujarat.

Significance of ASEAN for India

- ▶ India's support to ASEAN Centrality: It places ASEAN countries at the forefront of the vision of India's Indo-Pacific strategy and Act East Policy.
- Trade: ASEAN-India Trade in Goods Agreement (AITGA) is a Free Trade Agreement (FTA) signed in 2009 to boost trade ties.
 - Bilateral trade between the two stands around 123 Billion USD (2024-25).
- ▶ Counterbalancing China: ASEAN-India Joint Statement on Maritime Cooperation (2023) echoes upholding of international law in the South China Sea.
- **Development of India's North East:** ASEAN countries lie closest to India's Northeastern states with connectivity projects like Kaladan Multi-Modal Transit Transport Project passing through the region.
- ▶ Multilateralism: ASEAN framework highlights the importance of multilateralism, an essential focus of Indian foreign policy.

Timor Leste joins ASEAN as the 11th member

- **▶ About ASEAN:** Established in 1967 in Bangkok, Thailand, with signing of ASEAN Declaration (Bangkok Declaration).
- Other 10 members: Brunei Darussalam, Cambodia, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Myanmar, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, and Vietnam.





CONSERVATION OUTLOOK



IUCN World Heritage Outlook 4 report categorises Western Ghats as being of "significant concern"

Apart from Western Ghats, two national parks in India – Assam's Manas national park and West Bengal's Sundarbans national park – have also been categorised as being of "significant concern".

- ➤ IUCN World Heritage Outlook assesses the conservation prospects of all World Heritage sites inscribed for their natural values.
 - The outlook categorizes sites in four categories
 Good, Good with some concerns, Significant Concern, and Critical.
 - Significant concern outlook means that site's values and underlying attributes are threatened by several current and/or potential threats, requiring additional conservation measures.



- ▶ Length: About 1,600 km long, they are a chain of mountains older than the Himalayas and running parallel to India's western coast.
- Spread across six states: Gujarat, Maharashtra, Goa, Karnataka, Kerala and Tamil Nadu.
- Ecological Significance: A UNESCO world heritage site and one of 36 biodiversity hotspots on Earth.
 - Recognized as one of the world's eight 'hottest hotspots' being habitat to some 325 globally threatened (listed in IUCN's Red List) species including Nilgiri Tahr.
 - **⊙** Best representative of **non-equatorial tropical evergreen forests**.
 - Influence the Indian monsoon weather pattern, acts as key barrier intercepting rain-laden monsoon winds coming from southwest, and moderates tropical climate of the region.

Threats to Western Ghats

- ▶ Infrastructure Development: Hundreds of hydropower projects including proposed Sillahalla Pumped Storage Hydroelectric project in the Nilgiris.
- ▶ Land Use Conversion: Large part of range converted to agricultural land for tea, coffee, rubber and oil palm or cleared for livestock grazing, reservoirs and road.
- Human-Wildlife Conflict: Dense population in several parts and expansion of agriculture leads to increased human-wildlife conflict.
- Climate change: Forcing species like Nilgiri flycatcher to move from warmer lowlands to cooler higher areas.
- ▶ Invasive Alien Species: Such as eucalyptus and acacia colonising natural forests.

Rashtriya Vigyan Puraskar

Government announced Rashtriya Vigyan Puraskar 2025, highest recognition for outstanding and inspiring contributions by scientists, technologists, and innovators in diverse fields of science, technology, and technology-led innovation.

About Rashtriya Vigyan Puraskar

- Conferred under four categories:
 - Vigyan Ratna (VR) (lifetime achievements & contributions in any field of science and technology),
 - Vigyan Shri (VS) to recognize distinguished contributions in any field of science and technology
 - Vigyan Yuva-Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar (VY-SSB) for recognizing & encouraging young scientists
 - Vigyan Team (VT) for exceptional team work in science and technology.
- Prof. Jayant Vishnu Narlikar (Physics) was awarded Vigyan Ratna (VR) Posthumously.
 - He co-developed Hoyle-Narlikar theory of gravity an alternative to Einstein's general relativity and a counterpoint to the widely accepted Big Bang model.



National Biodiversity Authority (NBA)

National Biodiversity Authority (NBA) released funds to Biodiversity Management Committees in UP and Sikkim.

About NBA:

- Overview: It is a statutory, autonomous body under the Ministry of Environment, Forests and Climate Change.
- Established: In 2003 under the Biological Diversity Act, 2002.
- ▶ Headquarters: Chennai, Tamil Nadu.
- ▶ Functions: Performs facilitative, regulatory and advisory functions on issues of conservation, sustainable use of biological resources and fair and equitable sharing of benefits arising out of the use of biological resources.
- ➤ Complementary Entities: Under the Biodiversity Act, 2002 and the Biodiversity Rules, 2004, two complementary entities State Biodiversity Boards at the State level and Biodiversity Management Committees at the local village level have been established to complement the NBA.









Dark Matter

Recent studies suggests that dark matter could explain the mysterious gamma-ray glow at the Milky Way's centre.

About Dark Matter

- Meaning: It is regarded as the invisible glue that holds the universe together, making up most of the mass in galaxies and galaxy clusters.
 - Unlike normal matter, it does not interact with electromagnetic force, i.e., neither absorb, reflect or emit light, making it extremely hard to spot.
- Scientists estimate that dark matter makes up about 27% of the Universe.
- Significance: It is believed to shape the cosmos, organize galaxies and cosmic objects on a large scale.



Karakoram and Changthang Wildlife Sanctuaries (WLS)

Proposal to redraw the boundaries of Karakoram and Changthang sanctuaries in Ladakh has been received by the Central government. **About Karakoram WLS**

- Established in 1987.
- Location: Karakoram range, Ladakh.
- Fauna: Snow leopard, Himalayan brown bear, Himalayan wolf, ibex (Wild goat), wild blue sheep (Bharal), etc.
- Flora: Alpine vegetation, medicinal plants, cold desert flora etc. **About Changthang WLS**
- Location: Ladakhi Changthang plateau, Leh district.
- Significance: Home to highest altitude water lakes, namely, Tso Moriri, Pangong Tso and Tso Kar.
- Fauna: Snow Leopard, Tibetan Wild Ass, Dark-necked crane, etc.



National Song (Vande Mataram)

Prime Minister urged citizens to make the 150th year of the National **Song memorable** by carrying forward its values for future generations. **About National Song (Vande Mataram)**

- Composition: In Sanskrit by Bankimchandra Chatterjee.
 - The song was a part of Bankimchandra's most famous novel Anand Math (1882).
 - It shares an equal Status with Jana-Gana-Mana (National Anthem).
- First Sung: At the 1896 session (Calcutta) of the Indian National Congress by Rabindranath Tagore.
- Adopted on: 24 January 1950 by the Constituent Assembly of India as the National Song of India.



Coffee

Prime Minister highlighted that the Indian coffee is gaining popularity globally.

About Coffee

- India is now the seventh-largest coffee producer globally and 70% of coffee produced is being exported, earning \$1.80 billion during 2024-25.
- Key Coffee Growing Regions: Karnataka (Chikmagalur, Coorg and Hassan); Tamil Nadu (Pulney, Shevaroy, Nilgiri and Annamalai); Kerala (Wayanad, Travancore and Malabar).
- Soils: Deep, Fertile, rich in organic matter, well- drained and slightly acidic (PH 6.0-6.5)
- Growing Conditions: Gentle to moderate slopes with temperature of 15-30 0C, and annual rainfall of 1000-2500 mm.
- Types: Robusta and Arabica.



Global Financial Stability Report (GFSR)

International Monetary Fund (IMF) recently released the Global Finance Stability Report (GFSR), April 2025. **About GFSR**

- **Purpose:** Provide a regular assessment of global financial markets and identify potential systemic weaknesses before they lead to crises.
- **Key Findings**
 - Tightened Global Financial Conditions: Have caused significant increase in the Global financial stability risks.
 - Role of Major geopolitical risk events: Especially military conflicts, can lead to substantial decline in stock prices and increases in sovereign risk premiums.
- Other Key Reports by IMF: World Economic Outlook, Fiscal Monitor.

Vaikunthbhai Mehta

Birth Anniversary of Vaikunthbhai Mehta was celebrated. About Vaikunthbhai Mehta (1891-1964)

- Born in Bhavnagar Gujarat.
- Also called "Pioneer / Doyen / bhishma-pitahmah of the Co-operative Movement in India".
- **Key Contributions:**
 - Served the Maharashtra State Co-operative Bank **Chief Executive** for about 35 years.
 - He was Minister of Finance and Co-operation of the then Bombay State and was first Chairman of Khadi and Village Industries Commission.
 - Awarded Kaiser-i-Hind medal (1916) for his service to the co-operative movement.
 - Most trusted lieutenant of Gandhiji in the Khadi (homespun cotton) movement.
