RBI releases National Strategy for Financial Inclusion (NSFI): 2025-30

Strategy approved by Sub-Committee of Financial Stability and Development Council focuses to improve reliable last-mile access and effective use of financial services across the country.

About NSFI 2025-30

- It outlines five key goals (Panch-Jyoti) to improve financial inclusion in India, supported by 47 specific action points to achieve them.
- > The Panch Jyoti are:
 - Improving availability and use of equitable, suitable, and affordable bouquet of financial services to achieve financial safety and financial security for households and micro enterprises,
 - Adopting gender-sensitive approach for women-led financial inclusion and differentiated strategies for improving financial resilience of households, especially for the underserved and vulnerable segments,
 - Synergizing livelihood, skill development and support ecosystem and its linkages with financial inclusion,
 - ⊕ Leveraging financial education as a tool for promoting financial discipline, and
 - Strengthening quality of customer protection and grievance redressal measures.

Financial Inclusion (FI) and its growth in India

- ➤ FI means that individuals and businesses have access to useful and affordable financial products and services that meet their needs delivered responsibly and sustainably. (World Bank).
- ▶ RBI FI-Index has risen to 67 in 2025, up by 24.3% since 2021.
 - FI-Index captures financial inclusion across the country while representing different sectors such as banking, investment, insurance, pension etc.

Other Government Initiatives for Financial Inclusion

- National Strategy for Financial Inclusion (NSFI 2019-2024): Provides a roadmap for universal access to financial services.
- Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY) (2014): Facilitating the opening of over 56 crore bank accounts.
- Digital India: Expanded access to digital financial services.
- **▶ JAM Trinity (Jan Dhan-Aadhaar-Mobile):** Provided the necessary digital public goods infrastructure to leverage increasing mobile penetration.

World Health Organization (WHO) issues Global Guideline on the use of GLP-1 Medicines in treating Obesity

WHO conditionally recommends GLP-1 therapies for obesity as part of a broader approach including healthy diet, physical activity, and professional support.

These guidelines provides recommendations specifically for three GLP-1 drugs used in the long-term treatment of obesity in adults i.e. liraglutide, semaglutide and tirzepatide.

About GLP-1 drugs or GLP-1 agonists

- ➤ These are a class of drugs that mimic the hormone Glucagon-Like Peptide-1 (GLP-1), which is naturally released from the gut after meals.
- GLP-1 receptor agonists help control blood sugar by increasing insulin when needed and reducing glucagon.
 - They also slow digestion and reduce appetite, leading to better satiety and weight loss.
- ▶ They are used mainly for Type 2 Diabetes and obesity management.

About Obesity & its status

- Obesity is defined by excessive fat deposits leading to increased risk of type 2 diabetes, heart disease etc. It is having a Body Mass Index (BMI) of 30 or higher in adults.
 - → BMI is calculated by dividing a person's weight in kilograms by their height in meters squared (kg/m²).
- ▶ It affects more than 1 billion people and is associated with 3.7 million deaths worldwide in 2024.
 - 24% of Indian women and 23% of Indian men are obese. (NFHS-5 (2019-21)).







Supreme Court directs Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) to probe cases of digital arrests in India

Key directions related to digital arrest

- SC granted CBI full freedom to probe the role of bankers under the Prevention of Corruption Act,1988 where bank accounts are opened for the purposes of digital arrest scams.
- States including Punjab, Tamil Nadu, Uttarakhand and Haryana were instructed to give their consent under Section 6 of the Delhi Special Police Establishment Act for a pan-India probe by the CBI.
- ▶ It also impleaded Reserve Bank of India and sought its assistance in explaining the AI and machine learning tools used to identify fraudulent accounts.
- It also directed information technology service providers to cooperate fully with investigators.

What is digital arrest?

- Digital Arrest refers to a type of online scam where fraudsters impersonate law enforcement officials such as CBI, Police, ED etc. via phone calls, video calls and falsely accuse victims of involvement in criminal activities to extort money.
- ▶ Indians lost over Rs 120 crore to 'digital arrest' fraud schemes during the first quarter of 2024.

Initiatives by Government to Tackle Digital Arrest

- ▶ Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C): It has been set up by the Ministry of Home Affairs as an attached office to deal with all types of cybercrimes in the country.
 - Cyber Fraud Mitigation Centre (CFMC) has been established at I4C where representatives of major banks, Financial Intermediaries, Payment Aggregators, Telecom Service Providers work together to tackle cybercrime.
- ➤ Samanvaya Platform (Joint Management Information System): It provides analytics based on interstate linkages of crimes and criminals, involved in cybercrime complaints in various States/UTs.
- ➤ 'Report and Check Suspect' on https://cybercrime.gov.in: Central Government has introduced this feature which provides citizens a search option to search I4C's repository of identifiers of cyber criminals.

Parliamentary Panel Urges Stringent Policies Amidst Fertilizer Consumption Surge

A report by the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Chemicals and Fertilizers highlights India's progress toward self-sufficiency while simultaneously raising concerns over persistent malpractices and import dependence.

Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW) observes World AIDS Day 2025

The National AIDS Control Organization (under MoHFW) has been observing World AIDS Day annually on December 1 since 1992.

About Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) & AIDS

- **▶** HIV Virus is a retrovirus that targets CD4 immune cells and weakens the immune system.
- CD4 cells are a type of white blood cell that play a major role in protecting the body from infection.
- ➤ A retrovirus is a virus that uses RNA as its genomic material. Upon infection with a retrovirus, a cell converts the retroviral RNA into DNA, which in turn is inserted into the DNA of the host cell.
 - The cell then produces more retroviruses, which infect other cells.
- ▶ Treatment of HIV: Early testing and regular antiretroviral therapy (ART) suppress viral load and slow progression.
- ➤ Transmission: occurs through unsafe sex, shared needles, infected blood, mother-to-child routes etc.
- ➤ Acquired immunodeficiency syndrome (AIDS) is the most advanced stage of HIV infection.

HIV status in India

- Over 2.5 million people are living with HIV in India
 - ⊕ At 0.20%, India's prevalence is significantly lower than the global average of 0.7%,
- Declining Trends (2010-2024): Nationally, annual new HIV infections dropped by 48.7% and AIDS-related deaths fell by 81.4%.

Steps Taken by Government

- National AIDS and STD Control Programme (NACP) Phase-V: Central Sector Scheme aiming to end AIDS as a public health threat by 2030.
- ▶ India has adopted a 90-90-90 target for combating AIDS. This target was later increased to 95-95-95.
 - 95-95-95 Target: 95% of people living with HIV will know their status, 95% of those diagnosed will be on sustained ART, and 95% of those on ART will have viral suppression.
- ➤ Other: Mission Sampark, The HIV/AIDS (Prevention and Control) Act, 2017 etc.

Polygamy Law

Assam has passed the Assam Prohibition of Polygamy Bill, 2025.

➤ The bill introduces strict punishment, including imprisonment of up to 10 years for contracting a second marriage.

About Polygamy

- It means a system of marriage whereby one person has more than one spouse.
- It can be of two types:
 - Polygyny, where a man marries more than one woman.
- Polyandry, where a woman marries more than one man.
- ➤ Hindu Marriage Act,1955 prescribes punishment for bigamy.
- ➤ Section 82 of BNS deals with marrying again during the lifetime of a husband or wife, punishable with up to seven years' imprisonment and a fine.



Exercise Ekuverin

14th edition of Exercise Ekuverin is scheduled in **Thiruvananthapuram**, **Kerala**.

About Exercise Ekuverin

- It is an annual bilateral joint military exercise between the Indian Army and the Maldives National Defence Force.
- ➤ Origin: "Ekuverin" means "Friends" in Dhivehi; the exercise began in 2009 and alternates between India and the Maldives annually.
- ➤ Core Objectives: Build interoperability for counterinsurgency and counter-terrorism operations; conduct joint HADR drills; practise operations in semi-urban, jungle, and coastal terrain.



Masala Bond

ED probed the 'Masala Bond' issued by the Kerala Infrastructure Investment Fund Board (KIIFB). What are Masala Bonds?

- Masala Bonds are the rupee-denominated bonds issued to overseas buyers for raising money by the Indian corporates.
 These were introduced in India in 2014 by International Finance Corporation (IFC).
- Eligibility: Any investor from a FATF compliant jurisdiction would be eligible to invest.
- Benefit: Masala bond is an effort to protect issuers from currency risk and instead transfer the risk of currency to investors buying these bonds.









Sanchar Sarthi

Department of Telecommunications (DoT) smartphone manufacturers to pre-install the Sanchar Saathi app on new devices.

About Sanchar Saathi mobile app

- It was launched in 2025 to enhance transparent and secure mobile services.
- **Key-features:**
 - communications via calls, SMS, or WhatsApp especially KYC-updating scams.
 - blocking of lost or stolen phones anywhere in India.
 - easy way to verify whether a purchased mobile device is genuine.
 - calls, originating from numbers with the Indian country code +91 followed by 10 digits.
 - code, address, or ISP name.



GPS Spoofing

The Ministry of Civil Aviation has confirmed GPS spoofing at Delhi and several other major airports.

GPS spoofing

- ▶ It is also known as GPS simulation, refers to the practice of manipulating or tricking a GPS receiver by broadcasting false GPS signals.
- It misleads the GPS receiver into believing it is located somewhere it is not, resulting in the device providing inaccurate location data.
- This form of cyberattack undermines the reliability of GPS data, which is vital for a variety of applications, from navigation to time synchronization and more.



Brahmos Missile

Indian Army successfully conducts combat launch of BrahMos supersonic cruise missile.

About Brahmos Missile

- ▶ It is a two-stage Supersonic Cruise Missile with a solid propellant booster engine as its first stage and liquid ramjet as second stage.
- > Flight range of up to 290 km.
- > Its cruising altitude could be up to 15 km and terminal altitude as low as 5 m.
- ➤ It carries a conventional warhead upto 200 kgs.
- Features: Land-Attack / Anti-Ship Capabilities, Fire and Forget Principle of Operations, Large Engagement Envelop, Transport-cum-Launch Canister, Minimum Deployment Time etc.



Heron Mark-II

According to reports, India plans to procure additional Heron MK-II drones from Israel with discussions underway for local manufacturing.

About Heron Mark II

- ➤ Manufacturer: Israel Aerospace Industries (IAI).
- Category: Medium Altitude Long Endurance (MALE) unmanned aerial vehiclea (UAV) used for intelligence, surveillance and reconnaissance roles.
- ▶ Endurance: Can reach an altitude of 35,000 feet, speed of 150 knots and remain in the air for 45 consecutive hours.
- with Capabilities: Equipped advanced sensors. communication intelligence packages and satellite communication support which enables long range, beyond line of sight missions.



GIRG Framework

The Government of India has undertaken the Global Indices for Reforms and Growth (GIRG) initiative for driving reforms and growth in the country.

About Global Indices for Reforms and Growth (GIRG) Framework

- ➤ Purpose: It monitors India's performance on selected global indices to identify gaps and guide evidence-based reforms.
- **➤ Coverage**: Tracks **26 indices** across **four broad themes**: economy, governance, development, and industry, released by 16 international agencies.
- ➤ Implementation: 17 nodal ministries are assigned specific indices.
 - (DMEO), NITI Aayog coordinates data quality checks, methodology review, and reform implementation.
- ➤ Significance: Enhances transparency, strengthens policymaking, boosts India's global competitiveness, and supports cooperative and competitive federalism.



Pratyaksh Hanstantrit Labh (PAHAL) Scheme

PAHAL or Direct Benefit Transfer of LPG Scheme Delivers Efficiency, Transparency, and Consumer-Centric Reforms.

About PAHAL Scheme

- **Launched**: 2013.
- ➤ Ministry: Ministry Of Petroleum and Natural Gas
- Objective:
 - To ensure that LPG distribution and subsidy transfers in respect of domestic LPG consumers are efficient, transparent, and inclusive.
 - To curb the diversion of subsidized LPG for commercial use.
- **Process:** All domestic LPG cylinders are sold at a uniform Retail Selling Price (RSP) and applicable subsidy to LPG consumers is transferred directly into their bank accounts.
